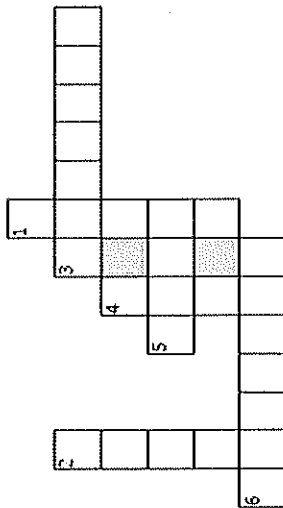

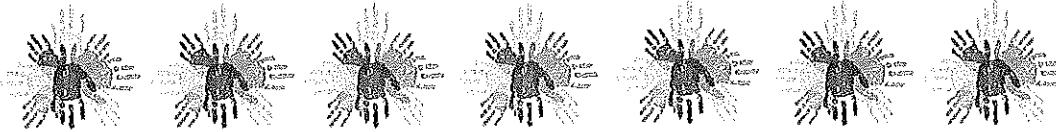

**Building a New Home**

After spending almost 20 years in a refugee camp in Nepal, Narayan and Chandra are grateful for the life they have built for their family with support from LSI's Refugee Community Services.

After marrying in the camp, Narayan and Chandra resettled to Des Moines in 2009. Everything was new. Everything was different. Their child, Aaman, was a newborn, and they found themselves overwhelmed with medical bills. Chandra desperately wanted to pursue her medical career. At the time, it seemed impossible.

But LSI helped Chandra enroll in college classes. Narayan started volunteering at LSI as an interpreter. Later, he became a full-time case manager with LSI, where he continues to lift up former refugees by connecting them to resources, educational activities, and supporting them as they pursue citizenship.

"LSI supported me and allowed me to provide for my family. It helped us establish ourselves in Iowa," he says.

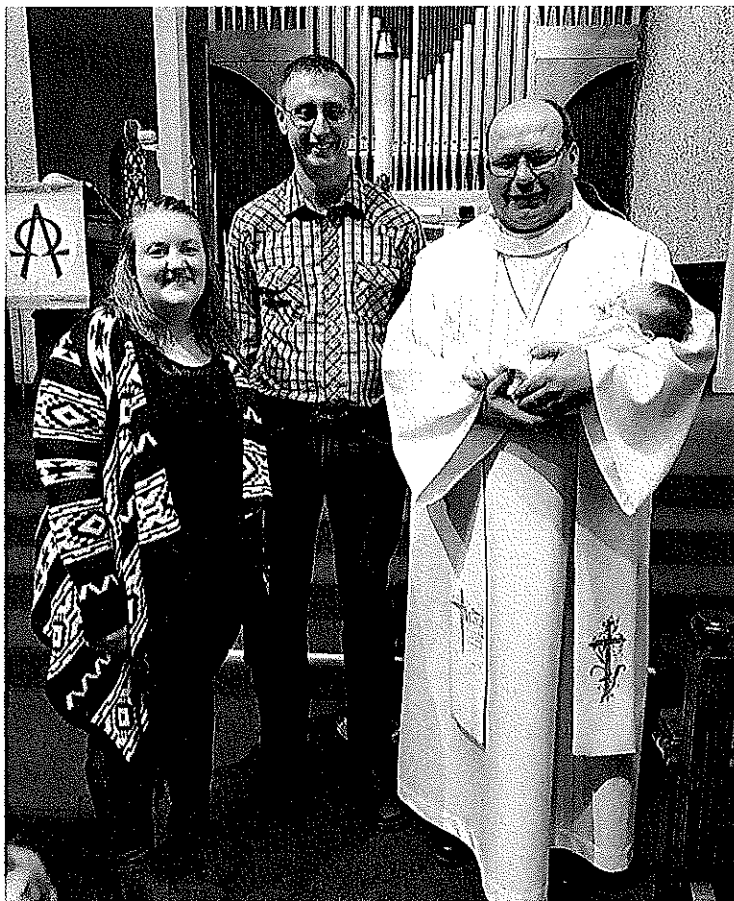
Chandra now works as a lab assistant in an Iowa pediatric clinic. Narayan and Chandra have become homeowners and feel confident, independent, and established in their new community.

### Postville Food Pantry

The Postville Food Pantry is operated under the auspices of the not-for-profit corporation, Postville Community Support which is governed by a Board of Directors comprised of area church members, clergy and area residents. Pastor Steve Brackett is the current President of the Board of Directors. The mission of the group is to serve the people of Postville and surrounding areas who are in need. They pledge to assist all people regardless of race, color, creed, national origin, ancestry, sex, marital status, disability, religious or political affiliation, age or sexual orientation.

The Postville Food Pantry came into existence in response to the needs of the people who lost their jobs due to a fire at Iowa Turkey Products in December of 2003. The pantry's first home was in the old hospital building on Oak Drive where the Food Pantry opened its doors June 23, 2004. When the old hospital building was sold by the City, the Food Pantry moved to its present location in space generously and graciously provided by Hall Roberts' Son on Greene Street.

The services of the Food Pantry proved to be invaluable following the Immigration and Customs Enforcement raid of the Agri-Processors Plant in May of 2008 and the bankruptcy of the plant the following November, both of which left workers and their families in dire need of assistance. Food and monetary donations came from all across the county to assist Postville Community Support in meeting the needs of these families. The Postville Food Pantry continues to serve hundreds of people each month.

The need for funding, both monetary and food products, is ongoing. Cash donations assist the Pantry in purchasing a great quantity of food at a reduced cost through the Northeast Iowa Food Bank in Waterloo. For every dollar donated, the pantry can help to provide about five meals to people in need through purchases from the Food Bank. Donations of food are also greatly appreciated. Donations may be dropped off at the Food Pantry at 1 p.m. on Tuesdays or at the Postville Herald Monday through Friday between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. The Pantry is open each Tuesday from 2-5 p.m. in the Hall Roberts' Building located at 133 West Greene in downtown Postville.

...the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned" (Matthew 4:16).

The season of Epiphany is where we find ourselves. From the Greek word *epiphania*, meaning "manifestation" or "revelation" is the time in the church year to celebrate the revelation of Christ as the Light of the World. In Matthew's gospel, we have John the Baptist quoting from the prophet Isaiah, to remind us that we are the people who sit in darkness, close to death. Yet, the appearance of light has dawned for us in the tiny baby born in Bethlehem.

Who is this child that the Magi traveled so far to meet? Who is this human baby born in a cattle stall? Who is this man who has such a drawing power? During this season of Epiphany, Jesus is at the center of all the attention. "But isn't Jesus always the center of attention" you may ask? The truth is, we all place other people and "things" at the center of our attention. We all sit in the darkness at times. Epiphany is the time to bring the Light of the World back into the hearts of our lives; focus the spotlight on Jesus.

In the verses of Matthew's gospel, we see Jesus in awesome and brilliant ways. We see him as he rises from the waters of his baptism accompanied by a dove. We see him teach in the synagogues and heal the sick. We see him transfigured in the presence of Peter, James, and John. We see him cause commotion where ever he goes.

As we pack away the Christmas decorations, we might leave aside a single candle or a strand of white lights to help us remember that the glory and dazzle of Christmas gives birth to the truth, that this human baby is the Light of the World. The greatest witness we can be to the Light comes in the faith sharing of our lives with others. This also serves to keep Christ at the center of our lives year-round. Happy New Year!

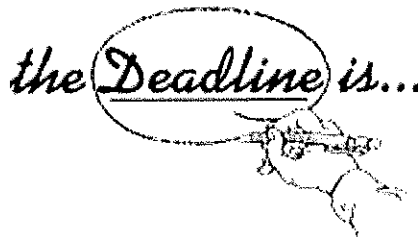
