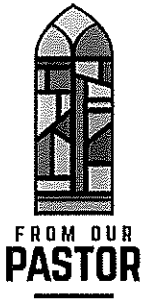

## St. Paul History

This month's featured window is "The Good Shepherd." This window was dedicated to the Sunday School Workers by Mr. & Mrs. Chas H. Krumm. Charles was married to Minnie Schierholz and had 2 daughters, Minnie Elizabeth Nordin (who had no children) and Effie Rosalie Martha Krumm who married Edwin J. Lammert. Martha and Edwin Lammert had 1 son, Clinton (Jake) Lammert who married Virginia Herwig. Jake served on council, organized ushers for 12 years and was church sexton for 10 years. Virginia Lammert was a 2<sup>nd</sup> grade school teacher and remedial reading teacher at Postville until 1984 and served as SCS Superintendent and taught Confirmation for many years as well as being an active Ladies Aid member. Their children were Patti (Thayer), Terry and Kent Lammert.

**1880**-Pastor John Knie came to serve St. Paul's in 1880 and served until April 20, 1881. From April 20, 1881 until July 1, 1882, St. Paul's was without a regular pastor. Throughout this period Pastors Seifert and Schuette of neighboring congregations rendered considerable assistance. On the 16<sup>th</sup> Day of January 1880 AD, the Articles of Incorporation were presented to H. A. Stowe, Notary Public.

**Articles of Incorporation:** Article of Incorporation of the German Evangelical Lutheran St. Paul's Church of Postville, Allamakee County, Iowa. For all men by these present that Mr. Conrad Thoma, Henry Eggert, Rudolf Meyer, Wm. Thoma, Henry Weihe, Carl Wagner, William Meyer, John Poesch and Henry C. Meyer, all citizens of the United States of America and the State of Iowa, desiring to associate ourselves together for the purpose of the advancement of education, morals and religion do hereby enact and adopt these Articles of Incorporation under Chapter 2, Title 9, of the Code of Iowa 1873.



*<sup>3</sup>After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. <sup>4</sup>While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; <sup>5</sup>for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." <sup>6</sup>So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" <sup>7</sup>He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. <sup>8</sup>But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:3-8).*

Can you imagine what it would be like 2000 years ago to be the disciples as Jesus was making his departure to the Father? Do you think that they were filled with fear and anxiety not knowing what was to come of them? They were still reeling from the reality of his tragic death; then he appears days later behind hidden doors because they were afraid. Here 40 days later, they are told to stay until they hear "the promise of the Father" to leave and be witnesses to all the end of the earth.

Well, here we are going on six weeks of physical isolation of Covid-19, and I feel just like the disciples not knowing what tomorrow is going to bring. But you know what? The Holy Spirit is with us during these times just as God was present with God's people during the flood, exile, wilderness, and deliverance of Israel. God was with Jesus at the time of his baptism and transfiguration proclaiming: "This is my beloved Son, listen to him!" Just as God was with Jesus on the cross and raised him from the tomb. Yes, God in Jesus Christ, through the work of the Holy Spirit is with us and will comfort us and lead us through these times of uncertainty.

I am praying for you and I am walking with you. I am inviting all of us to please be gentle with one another and yourselves – give yourselves some time to reflect, meditate, and rest. When we are confined to our home's emotions can and will escalate with our spouse, children, partner, and friends. And when this happens, please step back and just take a deep breath – we will get through this together, this will not last! If someone you know is going through difficult time, please reach out to them and let them know that they are loved and please remind yourself as well that you are a beloved child of God, too. This is a time to come together and support one another, not pull apart and be isolated from one another.

Please let us know if you need anything. If any of you or anyone you know needs food but are not wanting to go to the food pantry, please let me know. Northeastern Iowa Community Action is assisting in transporting food to people's homes, so you don't have to go to the food pantry. Just let us know as we will get the information forward.

God's peace be with you during these days and knowing that **WE ARE CHURCH TOGETHER!**

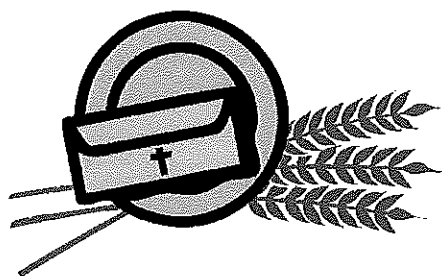

### Raising Healthy Families

As a child, Morgan had endured trauma no one should experience. Addiction, divorce, and difficult family relationships all surrounded Morgan in her childhood home. When she found out she was pregnant for the first time with her daughter, Sophia, Morgan was determined to never repeat the past she grew up with. She decided to enroll in LSI's Early Childhood Services.

Every week, her LSI worker, Ashley, would bring age-appropriate toys and games for Sophia to play with. She provided Morgan with educational resources to help her track Sophia's development and make sure her daughter was hitting all her important milestones. When Morgan welcomed her second child, Nolan, Ashley was with her every step of the way. It was Ashley who noticed that Nolan had developed a speech delay, and she helped Morgan connect with a speech therapist to correct it early.

Sophia is now in preschool and loves telling her mom about her teachers, friends, and the new songs she learned at school. Nolan is an active two-year-old who is learning new words every day. Morgan is currently finishing her Registered Nursing degree, and she dreams of working in emergency care at a hospital after graduation. And all the while, Ashley has been there to cheer them on.

"She's been more than a worker, she's been a friend when I've needed someone the most," Morgan says. "Being a new mom is hard. Having that extra person there, who doesn't judge you, who doesn't see your flaws, who is just there to help you -- you can't put a price on that."

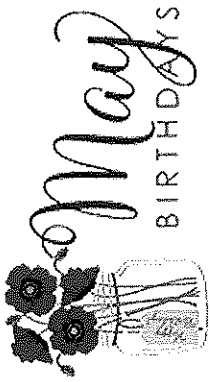
Please watch for announcements about when that will start again. We will try to have the garage sale this fall.

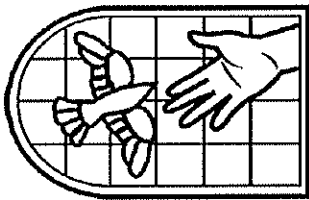

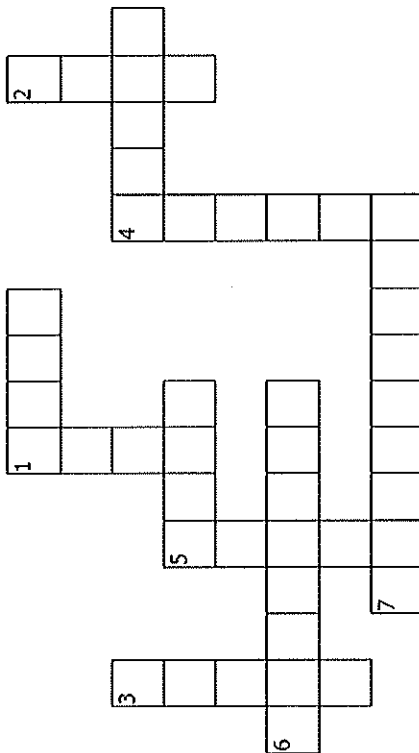
